MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

1 Introduction

Representatives from the International Safety and Health Construction Coordinators Organisation (ISHCCO) and the European Council of Civil Engineers (ECCE) have been in discussion about potential collaborations on projects aligned with each organisation's aims and objectives. Further to these discussions, both organisations have agreed to work together and help nutrure a mutually supportive relationship.

Both organisations would like to exchange ideas and viewpoints on a range of subjects, including potential areas for future bilateral co-operation. Both organisations hope this relationship will have an important and positive influence on developing a culture of prevention related to occupational safety and health (OSHI) in Europe and alobally.

2 Main Aims and Objectives

2.1 Aims of ISHCCO

ISHCCO represents the community of Safety and Health Construction Coordinators (SHCC). ISHCCO acts as the international umbrella association of the European national associations of SHCC. The Safety and Health Construction Coordinators are dedicated to coordinate the application of the inherent principles of occupational safety at temporary, mobile construction sites in particular according to the COUNCIL DIRECTIVE 92/57/EEC on the implementation of minimum safety and health requirements at temporary or mobile constructions sites minimum safety and health requirements at temporary or mobile constructions sites in

ISHCCO works to enhance the international network of Safety and Health Construction Coordinators to ensure a better level of protection of the safety and health of workers and particularly to guarantee the safety and health of workers at temporary or mobile construction sites according to the task defined in the CD92/57/EEC and its national transpositions.

According the statutes ISHCCO's purpose – in compliance with the spirit of subsidiarity – is to help the Safety and Health Co-ordinators of Europe, through its National Member Associations, by giving them the opportunity to improve their career development, to complete their training and to develop their scientific capacities, and in particular:
